1. Recitation from the Holy Quran:

2. Welcome Address:

Dr. Shanaz Ahamed, the Chairperson and the Principal of the College, welcomed all the Members and invitees to the Twenty Fourth Academic Council Meeting. She introduced the newly inducted University Nominees, Dr. K. Jothi Sivagnanam, Dr. M. Uma Maheswari and Dr. P.L. Chitra and the Management Nominee, Ms. Letika Saran to the other members of the Council.

The Principal was happy to announce that the Institution has been awarded the 'Star College Status' under the Star College Scheme of Department of Biotechnology, under the Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India, New Delhi and the five Science Departments (Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Biochemistry) will be receiving a total grant of Rs.1.59 crores for a period of three years from October 2020 to October 2023.

She also highlighted to the Members the achievement of the Department of English which has been recognized as a Research Department for the Ph.D. program in English from January 2021 onwards.



3. Result Analysis of the November 2019, April 2020 and November 2020 Examinations:



Mr. K. Allaudin, Management Nominee, suggested that the departments like Physics, Plant Biology & Plant Biotechnology, Historical Studies and Economics of Forenoon Session and Business Administration, Tourism & Travel Management of Afternoon Session which have scored less than 75% in the First Year End Semester November 2019 Examinations may take more efforts to improve their results above 90%.

Ms. Letika Saran, Management Nominee, raised a query as to whether the graduates are capable enough of being financially independent. The Principal explained that the Vision and Mission of the College is to empower students to gain a holistic development. Each course has employability and skill development components within it. Dr. Amthul Azeez, Vice-Principal (FN Session) also stated that the Departments offer Value Added Courses which will hone their skills in their respective fields. Dr. Firdouse Jahan, Vice-Principal (AN Session) added that the College has an Entrepreneur Development Cell and an Incubation Centre through which the students are imparted training on life skills, keeping in mind the concept of "Earn while you Learn" to motivate the students to become self-reliant.
